	Scholarship Loan Agreements (SLAs) are commonly used to promote the retention of apprentices in the unionized construction industry throughout the term of training and beyond. Under the <i>ALLIANCE's</i> Model SLA, the JATC/AJATC advances the cost of training to the apprentice, and the apprentice agrees to repay those costs, either in cash or in kind by working a specified number of years after graduation for contributing employers. We will discuss the current legal status of SLAs, the <i>ALLIANCE's</i> Model SLA and SLA alternatives.
