For the 2025 Graduates of NTI:

Congratulations! Before you pack your bags for NTI this year, there's some important information we need to share with you.

All graduates must attend a meeting on Monday, July 28th at 4:00 pm. Room: LA 240.

During this meeting, your graduating class will be required to select a representative to be the point of contact between the *electrical training ALLIANCE* (etA) and the graduating class.

This is a special ceremony for the leadership of the IBEW, NECA, and electrical training ALLIANCE to honor you, the graduates. All graduates wishing to participate in Thursday's Graduation Ceremony at the Michigan Theater must wear business professional attire. * If you do not meet this requirement, you will NOT be permitted to participate in the event.

*Business Professional attire: suite jacket, tie, dress pants, dress shirt, dress, slacks, blouse, shoes. Men are required to wear a suit jacket and tie.

Sunglasses, ball caps, tennis shoes, and other footwear such as sandals, flip flops, etc., are not considered business professional.

Graduates who choose not to dress appropriately will not be permitted to walk across the stage during the Graduation Ceremony.

Once you have chosen a class representative to speak on your behalf during the Graduation Ceremony, their brief remarks are to be submitted to Denise Jenkins, with the etA, **by 12:30 p.m.** on **Wednesday, July 30th.** The time allotted for the class representative's speech is 4 minutes. This is a time to celebrate the whole class's accomplishments and gratitude to our great industry. The remarks should keep the celebratory atmosphere of the graduation with words of wisdom from their four years of learning.

Traditionally, the graduating class has raised money for a charity during the week. This is not a requirement. This year, if the graduating class chooses to raise funds for a charity, the money will ONLY be collected among the graduating class during the graduate meeting on Monday, July 28th at 4:00 pm. Come prepared to donate during this meeting if you wish to participate. This will be the ONLY time money will be collected due to the no soliciting rule of EMU and WCC. Once the money is collected, it will be counted, and the etA will get a cashier's check to the charity of your choice. To that end, the charity must be decided upon during the meeting and provided to Denise Jenkins.
